Nursery (Birth – Age 4) and Kids' Corner begins at 10:15

<u>Kids' Corner (K-4th):</u> For children, Christian love is Kindness. We will explore the many ways to express kindness during Lent through the conversations and experiences of the characters in the book, "The Boy, The Mole, The Fox, and the Horse," by Charlie Mackesy. The first few lines in the book are:

- "Hello," said the boy.
- "I'm so small," said the mole.
- "Yes," said the boy, "but you make a huge difference."
- "What do you want to be when you grow up," asked the mole?
- "Kind," said the boy.

Along with The Boy, The Mole, The Fox, and The Horse we learn about kindness, patience, self-doubt, fear, longing, trust, forgiveness, compassion, friendship, family, and love; through experiments, storytelling, crafts, and prayer.

We look forward to being with the children as we discover the ways we can share kindness with all God's children.
