Finance Commission announcements:

August Year-to-Date

Income -

Through August, Collections & Offerings of \$103,419 were \$7,873, or 7%, below the budget of \$111,292.

- Pledging Member giving of \$93,888 is \$561 over budget.
- Non-Pledging Member & Guest giving of \$9,531 is \$8354 or 47%, below budget. However, this shows an improvement from July.
- YTD pledges were under budget by \$7873 with August being under budget by \$4,190. June and July were stronger than usual.

Expenses -

August year-to-date expenses of \$129,144 were \$4375, or 3%, lower than the 2023 year-to-date budget.

Overall -

• Through August year-to-date, expenses exceeded giving by \$22,542 while the budget projected a net loss of \$19,179. So, year-to-date August 2023 results are \$3,363 below budget due to offsetting lower than budget expenses as in travel, music & supplies and office expenses.
